



# IHMSA Small Bore Silhouette at Greenville Gun Club

## *General Information*

### **When?**

IHMSA Small Bore Pistol Silhouette matches are to be held the third Sunday of every month. Matches begin at 8:30AM and run no later than 4:00PM. You do not need to be present during the entire match as relays are fired on a freestyle basis.

### **Where?**

### **Do I Need to Be A Member?**

You do not need to be a member of Greenville Gun Club to shoot in IHMSA matches. You do need to join IHMSA in order to shoot past your first match. Membership is currently \$35/year and includes your IHMSA scorecard, rulebook and subscription to the newspaper.

### **What Does it Cost?**

The entry fee is \$5.00 per gun. This is for a standard 40-Target match.

### **What Do I Need to Bring?**

Any safe, BATFE legal .22LR pistol and 50 rounds of any factory loaded .22LR ammo per entry that you wish to fire. There are several categories of handguns and the match director can help you determine which category your handgun would fall in to. You may also need, among countless other things:

- 1) A shooting / range box of some sort. Anything from a fancy oak range box to a plastic tote will work fine, but handguns may only be carried to the line in some sort of container.
- 2) Shooting glasses and ear protection are mandatory on the firing line at all times. Competition specific glasses with moveable lenses and blinders as well as Merit style apertures are helpful.
- 3) Shooting gloves are optional but recommended. Nothing big and padded like Rifle gloves are allowed – stick with the basic style with the finger tips cut off like Uncle Mike's.
- 4) Blast Shield for shooting revolver and leg wrap for all freestyle positions very highly recommended for safety.
- 5) Sight blackener for all iron sight guns is recommended.
- 6) An inexpensive countdown timer that you can set to 2:30 is helpful – several are out there for under \$10.
- 7) A screwdriver to set you scope or iron sights between yard lines...unless you are hard core Old School.
- 8) A shooting mat...or piece of old carpet...for all freestyle positions is a big help.
- 9) An elbow pad for freestyle positions aids in comfort.
- 10) Good binoculars or a spotting scope...and don't forget your spotter (shooting partner) to tell you where you hit.
- 11) Pen/Pencil to keep your score with...and probably your range book for each pistol.
- 12) Food and drinks if you plan to shoot more than 1 gun.
